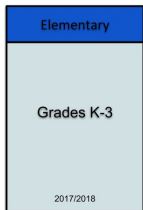
WHY SUMMER READING IS IMPORTANT



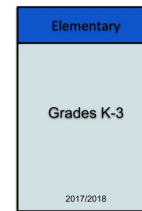

Children who don't read during the summer can lose up to two months of learning by the time they return to school in the fall.



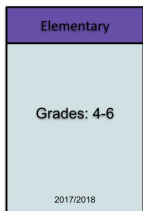

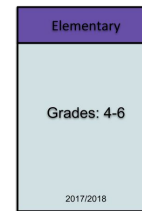


